# A Message from the CEO

Dear N Street Village Community,

The Village has been welcoming each woman who walks through our doors for more than a half century! As I stood on N Street during our SHERO Community Day in October, I was reminded how the decades-long



interfaith effort to support some of the most vulnerable women in our community started.

Radical hospitality was at the center of the decision to open the doors of Luther Place Memorial Church to people displaced after rioting destroyed neighborhoods in the wake of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.'s assassination. A quarter century later, N Street Village expanded and opened our Flagship location in 1996. This site – 1333 N Street, NW – is just one of the seven Village locations we have throughout the city now.

## No matter the location, our mission is the same.

N Street Village provides a continuum of supportive services - for clients who might spend a few nights, a few months, a few years, or a few decades with the Village. We partner with women to achieve stability and to make meaningful gains in their housing, income, employment, mental and physical health, and addiction recovery status.

Women who come through our doors find hope and healing.

Seven days a week, women can walk through our gate and sit down for breakfast and lunch at the Bethany Day Center. They can access showers, wash their clothes, and participate in a variety of activities. At the Wellness Center, women have the opportunity to see a doctor, participate in a meditation class, or access other resources to help meet their physical, behavioral and mental health needs.

In the coming year and years, we are growing our capacity to provide more behavioral and mental health support as we tackle mental health as a root cause of homelessness.

We are expanding our literacy offerings to enhance functional literacy in key areas, including health and financial literacy.

And as our society ages, we see that reflected in the clients we serve. To meet the needs of the growing number of older women, we are building out our capacity to provide geriatricfocused care.

Our work would not be possible without each person who shows up to volunteer, engage, and support N Street Village throughout the year. Your commitment and your contributions increase our impact as we partner with hundreds of women each year.
